Software Overview

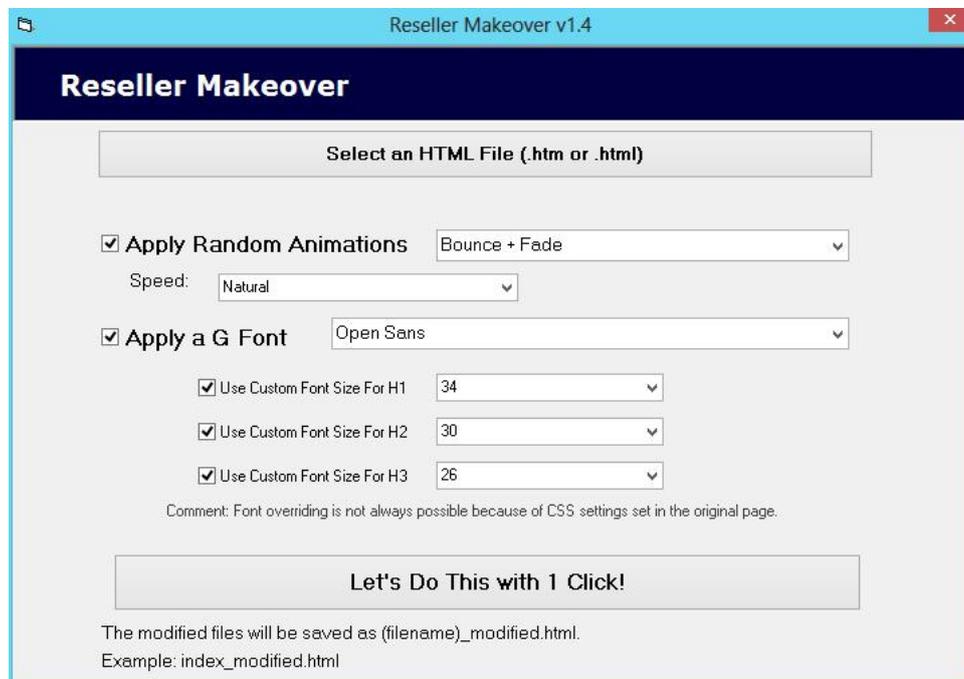
“**Reseller Makeover**” is a Windows software that allows you to quickly add animations to html pages (files with .htm / .html extension) with just one click.

In addition to this, you can easily override the global font of the html page with a modern Google font.

This is great to “bring to life” .htm pages that are usually shipped with products that come with distribution rights (like PLR products or products with Resale Rights).

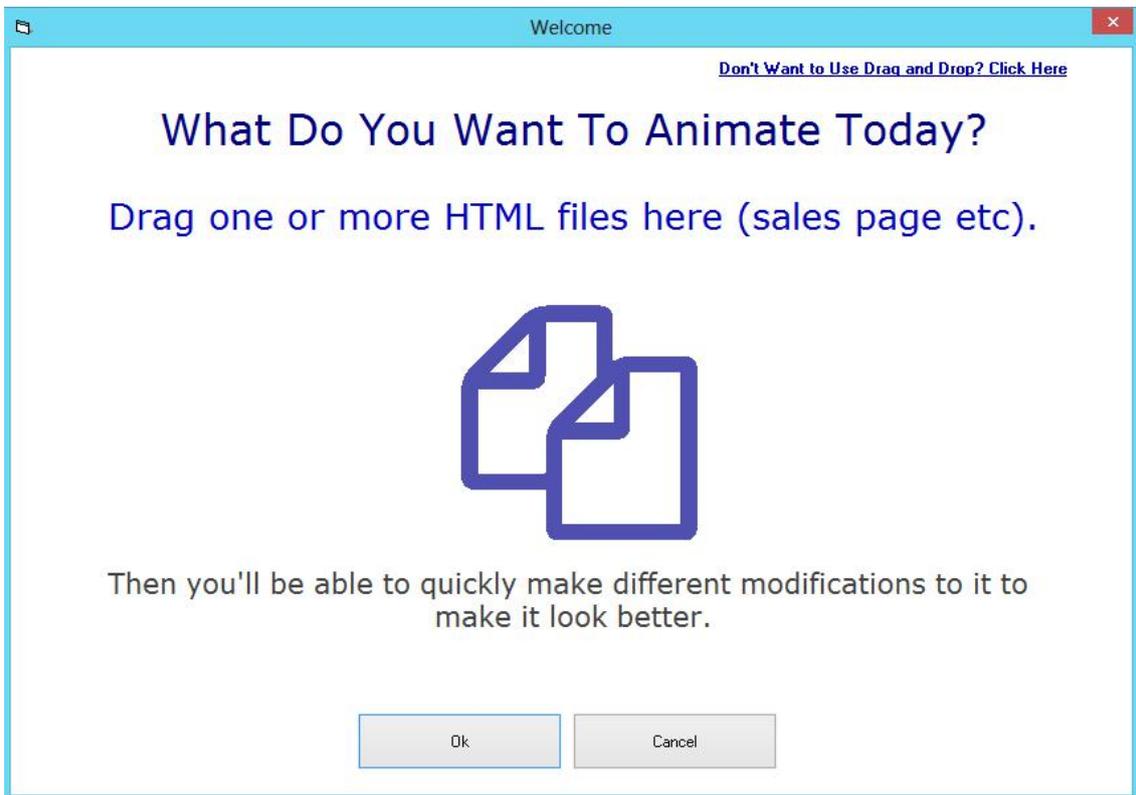
Using the Software

Using the software is really easy:

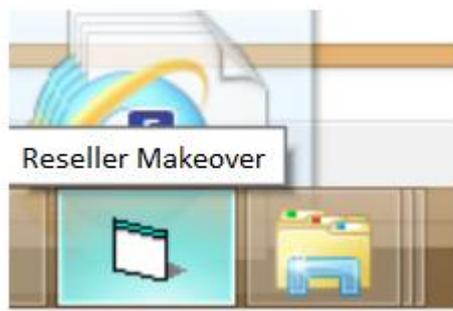


Step 1: Select an .htm or .html file to modify.

Select an HTML File (.htm or .html)



Drag the file/s (.htm or .html) that you want to edit, to the software to the “Reseller Makeover” app (the app will be in the task bar as you’ve opened it before) ...



When you move your mouse over the app (holding the file that you want to edit), the following screen will popup.

Drop the file there and click “Ok”.

Step 2: Check “Apply Random Animations” and select an animation style.

Comment: later, if you don't like the results, you can try with another configuration.

Step 3: Check “Apply a G (Google) Font” and select one from the list.

The following options allow you to set a specific font size for the H1 to H3 Headlines.

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Use Custom Font Size For H1	34
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Use Custom Font Size For H2	30
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Use Custom Font Size For H3	26

You can use these options if you find that the Google font of your choice looks too big when it's used as H1, H2 or H3.

PRO Version

In the “Pro” version, you will also find the following option:

From there you can add a function to any page to control the “Back” button (you can redirect your visitors to any url when they click it).

Step 3: Click the following button...



Let's Do This with 1 Click!

And that's all. After doing this, the software will create a copy of your selected file, but ending with **"_modified.html"**.

Just open this file with a modern browser that fully supports CSS animations (like Google Chrome or Firefox - if you use IE, animations won't display), and see if everything is ok.

If you want to make some changes, just change some settings and click the previous button again.

If things are ok, you can delete the original one (but we strongly recommend you to keep it with another name) and rename this one with the name of the original one.

Once that everything is ok...

1. Upload the modified page to your website +
2. Upload the **"anilibs"** folder (which was added to the output folder).

Final Comments and Tips

Adding More Google Fonts

If you want to add new fonts, just pick their name and add them to the "gfonts.txt" file (you can find this file under the installation folder -> "Snippets" subfolder).

About the Animations

The animations will work well on modern browsers (like Chrome or FireFox). And for visitors using other browsers (like Internet Explorer), the animations won't show.

Are Headlines Too Big?

If after using a Google font you notice that the headlines are too big, you can use a custom font size and that should fix that.

Final Comments

If a page already has animations, then we recommend you to not add animations to it as this can cause conflicts.

Please notice that (depending on how an html page has been coded), sometimes you may experience that a Google Font can't be applied to one or more areas of a document.
